

About Tennessee High School

The Bristol, Tennessee Public School System was organized in April of 1888; the Baptist Academy on Anderson Street was rented for the girls' school, and the boys attended school in an old building on the corner of Anderson and Tenth Streets that was commonly referred to as the "Cornfield Academy." In 1893, the first new public school building was built on Fifth Street next to King College. Grades four through ten were taught in the school, which employed seven teachers and one principal. The younger children continued to attend school at the "Cornfield Academy" on Anderson Street. In 1916, a new building was built on Alabama Street and became the first official Tennessee High School, then a four year high school. In 1939, the initial portion of the present-day Tennessee High School including the Stone Castle was built on Edgemont Avenue. Since that time, additions have been added at roughly ten-year intervals, the most recent being when the entire complex was completely renovated and Viking Hall, an 8,000 seat arena, was added to the facility in 1977. Today, THS has an enrollment of over 1,100 students and offers a college preparatory curriculum as well as vocational education. Tennessee High employs 78 classroom teachers, 6 administrators, 2 librarians, and 4 guidance counselors. THS also offers numerous clubs and extra-curricular activities to enrich student life. This includes 19 varsity sports teams for boys and girls.



Holiday Hoops History

In 1996, the Tennessee High Lady Viking coaching staff decided it wanted to promote girls' basketball in Northeast Tennessee and the Bristol community by establishing a holiday showcase for the sport. They hatched a plan to invite another local team and two teams from outside the area to participate in a challenge format over two days with each of the local teams taking on the teams form out of the area. After two years, the field was expanded to six teams and the event to three days. In 2002, THS coach Kim Bright decided to switch to a tournament format and expand the field to its current eight teams. The first year of tournament play was a rousing success with an exciting final as Charlotte (NC) Christian topped Cawood, KY. Thus far, the tournament has featured teams from Tennessee, Virginia, North Carolina, South Carolina, Kentucky, Georgia, West Virginia, and the District of Columbia.







Frank "Doc" Maples

The tournament is dedicated to honor a true Viking icon, long-time THS science teacher Frank Maples. Mr. Maples taught at THS for over 50 years, retiring in 2004. He is one of the most beloved figures in the history of the school. During his time at THS, he taught several generations of Vikings and impacted countless lives. Doc was well known for the way he taught his chemistry classes to use the Bunsen burner. They used it to make Doc's famous fudge. Mr. Maples was also a prolific cook and prepared the food for numerous athletic banquets, pregame meals, and collegiate signing ceremonies. Doc passed away in the summer of 2016 at the age of 90. Tennessee High School, the Lady Viking basketball program, and the Holiday Hoops Tournament are thrilled to be able to honor him in this way.
